- Mission: Loving our neighbors by our actions and inactions



June Nurse's Notes

June and July are **National Fireworks Safety Months**. According to the American Academy of Ophthalmology, thousands of people, many of them children, suffer eye injuries from fireworks each year in the United States. In the most severe cases, fireworks can rupture the globe of the eye, cause chemical and thermal burns, corneal abrasions and retinal detachment — all of which can permanently cause eye damage and affect vision. Nearly half of those injured are not handling the fireworks themselves, but merely observing. The best way to avoid injury is to attend a public professionally run fireworks exhibit. If your eyes are injured, do NOT rub, rinse or remove foreign objects. Do NOT apply pressure. If something has penetrated or is protruding from your eye, cove with a small paper cup, tape or hold in place, and go to the emergency room immediately.

June is **National Cataract Awareness Month**. According to Your Sight Matters.org, Cataracts are the leading cause of vision loss in the United States, and it is the leading cause of blindness in the world. Cataracts are a clouding of the lens of the eye, which prevents passage of light into the eye. The solution to cataracts is cataract surgery, which requires a surgeon to remove the deteriorated lens and replace it with an artificial lens called an intraocular lens. Symptoms of cataracts include: Painless cloudy, blurry or dim vision, more difficultly seeing at night or in low light, sensitivity to light and glare, seeing halos, faded or yellow colors, double vision within one eye, a need for bright light for reading. See an ophthalmologist if you have symptoms.

June is **Men's Health Month**. Studies have shown that men are less likely than women of a similar age to seek medical care and more likely to put it off. Go to http://www.menshealthnetwork.org/library/pdfs/GetItChecked.pdf for a list of screenings you should be having done in each age range. Many chronic diseases are preventable and have a silent start. If you are over 50, you should see a physician annually.


Free Community Dinner
