## A note from Pastor Drew

The theme for this year's Stewardship season is: "Laying a Foundation of Love and Hope." For me, this reflects two aspects of the projects we are raising money to accomplish. The first is a **literal laying of a foundation** by repaving our parking lots and replacing the wheelchair ramp. Both of these projects require secure foundations so that they can support all of the people who will be driving, walking or wheeling across them.

The second aspect, however, is that we are laying a **foundation for the future.** The improvements to our campus are not quick fixes, but are intended to last for many years to come. Additionally, the establishment of an endowment for our church is also going to be a gift that will keep giving to all those who will worship and serve here long after us.

Upon these strong foundations is a church that serves as a **beacon of love and hope** around our county. The bi-monthly community dinners serve our guests love and hope right alongside the warm and delicious food that is prepared. The kitchen improvements that are a part of the campaign will allow these meals and all the other hospitality ministries of our church to be more effective.

On **Sunday, September 28**<sup>th</sup> we will be celebrating the foundations and outreaches of our church. On that day, we are taking up three special offerings:

- 1. One year pledge card towards the **General Ministry Budget.** This is our first priority because it allows our church to function and continue all of the ministries we currently have.
- 2. A Three-year pledge card with an estimate of your capital campaign donations,
- 3.A special "first fruit" offering. This offering is an opportunity to jump start your campaign giving. All the money raised in this first offering will go directly towards paying off the loan early so that we decrease our interest payments.

I invite each of you to be in prayer this month about how you will participate in this campaign by asking God, "Lord, what do you want to do through me?" I am confident that if each of us has this conversation with God, together, we will accomplish far more than we could imagine on our own and position our church right where God would like for us to be.

## September Nurse's Notes

Students and teachers are headed back to school this month! A few health observances center around the start of school. September is National Pediculosis Prevention Month/Head Lice Prevention Month. This topic always gives people the heebie-jeebies (a term Gramma used). Pediculosis is a communicable disease affecting children and families across the nation and around the world and the most widely used treatments are pesticides (pediculicides). No pesticide treatment is completely safe or effective and lice resistance to them is common. Screening for head lice and nits is a healthy hygiene measure and not just something to do when you hear of another infested child. Manual removal of the live lice and nits is the safe alternative and a necessary component of any head lice treatment regimen. The NPA recommends the LiceMeister® Comb to enable families to screen often, detect head lice early and thoroughly remove lice and nits. More information available on-line.

National Suicide Prevention Week is September 7-13 If you're struggling, please reach out for help. To start, you could copy these messages and send to a trusted contact (from International Association for Suicide Prevention):

When you get a chance can you contact me? I feel really alone and suicidal and could use some support.

I don't want to die, but I don't know how to live. Talking with you may help me feel safe. Are you free to talk?

This is really hard for me to say but I'm having painful thoughts, and it might help to talk. Are you free?

There are things that may indicate someone is considering suicide. Talking about being a burden, Being isolated. Increased anxiety. Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain. Increased substance use. Looking for a way to access lethal means. Increased anger or rage. Extreme mood swings.

The WMU Suicide Prevention Program makes the following suggestions:

- 1. Recognize the warning signs of depression and suicide risk.
- 2. Take suicidal statements seriously and trust your instincts.
- 3. Get involved and use "active listening."
- 4. Encourage the person to seek professional help.
- 5. While directly asking about suicide can be scary, the person you're concerned about needs you to ask, "Do you feel so badly you are thinking about suicide?"
- 6. If the answer is "Yes," take the person's response seriously and continue the "Suicide Risk" assessment questions.
- 7. Do not leave a person whom you feel is "high risk" for suicide alone, even for a moment.
- 8. If the person in crisis has taken some form of life-threatening action, get help immediately 988 Suicide or crisis lifeline.

If you are feeling suicidal, please reach out now.
