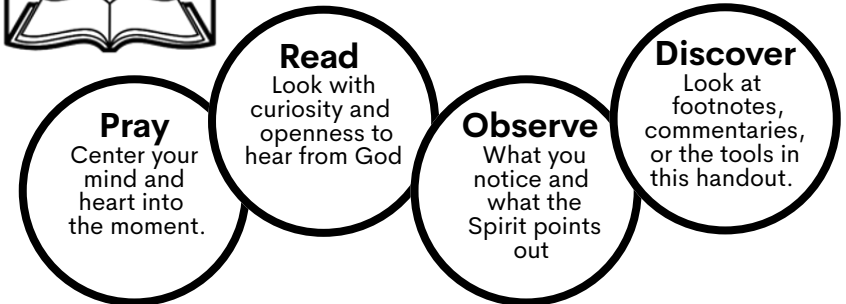

Intro

The Wesleyan tradition finds its focal point in the heart as the Spirit of God redirects our passions, restores our relationships with God and one another, and sets our hearts on fire with the love of God in Christ. John Wesley experienced that transformation at Aldersgate where he felt his "heart strangely warmed." The doctrines he had believed with his brain became a soul-warming fire in his heart.
